

DISSEMINATION REPORT

1. Executive Summary

The *ReThink HPV Vaccination project* has been a transformative initiative aimed at tackling low HPV vaccination rates and inequalities in vaccine access across EU countries. Despite the availability of highly effective vaccines, disparities persist due to lack of awareness, misinformation, limited healthcare recommendations, and socio-economic barriers.

This project sought to redesign HPV vaccination strategies through personalized communication campaigns, healthcare training, and social innovation. The key pillars of the initiative included:

- Developing targeted awareness campaigns to combat misinformation and vaccine hesitancy
- Training healthcare professionals and community leaders on effective HPV vaccine advocacy
- Enhancing collaboration between EU health initiatives to strengthen policy impact
- Conducting research on behavioral determinants of vaccination to inform evidencebased interventions

Key Achievements

- Extensive dissemination and stakeholder engagement The project was presented at multiple high-level EU health policy events, scientific conferences, and expert roundtables, including the Fighting Cervical Cancer Roundtable (March 4, 2023), European Cancer Policy Event (June 22, 2023), Aspen Healthcare Summit (October 19, 2023), and the First Summit on HPV Prevention (June 19, 2024).
- Strategic collaboration with EU-funded health initiatives ReThink HPV Vaccination engaged with the PROTECT-EUROPE and PERCH projects, aligning efforts on knowledge campaigns, training, and dissemination to maximize impact.
- Media and public awareness campaigns The project reached an audience of over 11.5 million people through TV interviews, radio broadcasts, online media, and symbolic awareness events, including the illumination of the Romanian Parliament in turquoise for International Day for the Elimination of Cervical Cancer (November 17, 2023).
- Research-driven policy contributions A national study in Romania (2023-2024) identified critical barriers to vaccination, revealing that 67% of respondents had never received an HPV vaccination recommendation from medical personnel. These findings were used to inform EU policy discussions and support the Council Recommendation on Vaccine-Preventable Cancers.





Healthcare training and digital innovation – The project developed specialized training modules and a digital knowledge platform to equip healthcare professionals, policymakers, and community leaders with the tools needed to promote HPV vaccination effectively.

2. Dissemination Activities

The project was introduced and discussed at **several high-profile meetings and roundtables** to ensure collaboration with key stakeholders:

• **PROTECT Europe Project Kick-off Meeting (January 26, 2023)**

Presentation by **Mrs. Mihaela Geoana**, President of the Renasterea Foundation. During the event, the project activities and the main objective of the ReThinkHPVaccination project were presented. Participants were informed about the main purpose of this project, which is to support EU member states and countries in the process of EU enlargement to rethink and restart their HPV vaccination campaigns, thus bringing them closer to achieving the objectives of the European Cancer Plan and the Cancer Mission regarding HPV vaccination and cancer prevention.

• Fighting Cervical Cancer Roundtable (March 4, 2023, U.S. Embassy, Bucharest) A key policy discussion with 38 stakeholders to mark HPV Awareness Day.

Mrs. Geoana, President of the Renasterea Foundation, presented the main elements of funding and the main objective of the project, namely to change mentalities and reduce inequalities in HPV vaccination and personalized curricula.

Participants were informed about the main purpose of this project, which is to support EU member states and countries in the process of EU enlargement to rethink and restart their HPV vaccination campaigns, thus bringing them closer to achieving the objectives of the European Cancer Plan and the Cancer Mission regarding HPV vaccination and cancer prevention.

The policy roundtable was about bringing together 38 participants, stakeholders involved in the implementation of the HPV Vaccination Program to mark the HPV Awareness Day (March 4) and to discuss the importance and key solutions to increasing HPV vaccination coverage. Mrs. Geoana, President of the Renasterea Foundation, presented the main objective of the project, namely to change mentalities and reduce inequalities in HPV vaccination. 23 high level speakers and participants were informed about the main purpose of this project.

The EPF/ECO HPV Prevention Policy Atlas launched event had involved discussions on various aspects of HPV prevention policies in Romania. Key topics included the findings of the HPV Prevention Policy Atlas Europe 2023, the advantages of the EU Beating Cancer Plan for Romania, challenges and opportunities in HPV prevention policies, and strategies for moving towards HPV elimination in the country. The event fostered dialogue and collaboration among stakeholders to strengthen HPV prevention efforts in Romania.





The event was co-organized in partnership with the European Parliamentary Forum on Sexual and Reproductive Rights (EPF) and the European Cancer Organization (ECO) with the participation of Mrs. Hanna Sarkkinen, Minister of Health from Finland.

May 16-17, 2023: 4P-CAN Horizon Project Launch

The ReThinkHPVaccination Project was mentioned as an important effort in Romania in understanding the low rate of vaccination during the 4P-CAN Project Kick-off meeting (coordinated by INOMED), in the context of the 4P-CAN's aim to address cancer primary prevention implementation strategies, following the European Code Against Cancer. As part of the 4P-CAN project activities related to HPV vaccination, INOMED team went to Plovdiv, Bulgaria, meeting with Bulgarian HPV vaccination stakeholders, Montenegrin public health experts, as well as Macedonian experts to discuss, among others, the national situation of vaccination in those countries and Romania. The ReThinkHPVaccination projects was briefly presented, focusing on how it builds personalized messages after understanding the local situation to increase adherence to HPV vaccination.

• October 12, 2023: European Conference on Tobacco Control in Florence, Italy

The Learning Centre of Florence played host to an enlightening session dedicated to the 4P-CAN Project during the European Conference on Tobacco Control. Organized by one of 4P-CAN's project partners and Lead of Work Package 2, ENSP (European Network for Smoking and Tobacco Prevention), the conference drew leading figures from across Europe (IARC representatives, members of ECPC, Spain and Italy public health authorities and so on). 

We are aligning with the Council Recommendation on Vaccine Preventable Cancers by enhancing communication about vaccination among parents and young people, and by addressing and countering mis- and disinformation related to HPV vaccination. We created a training curriculum focused on HPV vaccination communication methods and tools, and we are implementing a pilot project aimed at improving communication of the anti-HPV Vaccination benefits, in two Romanian counties with low vaccination rates—Arges and Vrancea.

<u>The ReThink HPV project</u>, co-funded by the European Union through the EU4Health Programme, aims to be a transformative initiative for improving anti-HPV Vaccination rates in Romania and EU Countries, with similar low vaccination figures. This project is implemented by a dynamic consortium based in Romania: Renasterea Foundation for Women's Health – as leader, the Centre for Innovation in Medicine, and the Eurocomunicare Association – as partners.

Despite HPV-generated cancers being some of the most preventable, vaccine uptake remains alarmingly low in Central and Southern Europe, including Romania. HPV is responsible for 99.7% of cervical cancers, with types 16 and 18 causing the majority. Our mission is to change this narrative, bridging the gap in vaccination rates across Europe through innovative, personalized communication and training rooted in social innovation.

Our recent national study in Romania (2023) highlighted that while 79% had heard of HPV, 67% had not received vaccination recommendation from any medical personnel. A significant portion of the population believes in the safety and necessity of the vaccine, yet the primary barrier remains a lack of recommendation from the doctors.

By improving communication and training methods around HPV vaccination, we aim to increase vaccination rates, especially in regions with previous low uptake. Our goals include building confidence in the effectiveness of vaccine among parents and young people, offering healthcare professionals and key stakeholders the knowledge and communication tools to





effectively promote HPV vaccines, and empowering the local and county public health leaders, to continue the communication of the benefits of the HPV Vaccine, beyond the project's duration.
